'A problem shared is a problem halved' That's how the old saying goes. 'If we share together the ups and the downs we increase the joy and lessen the sorrow' is a similar sentiment I was brought up with in Northern Ireland. A place where the idea of community was both a helpful and unhelpful thing. In those city streets, villages and towns where the community was exclusive in who belonged and who didn't, it contributed to a 'them versus us' mentality, which only added to the sorrows. A vital part of the Northern Ireland peace process, that continues to be vital even today, is the work done to encourage communities to be inclusive. To lay aside the 'them and us' and recognise, the reality, that there is only really an 'us'. When we share our lives with others in community we genuinely increase the joy.

I saw this in action from March 2020 when I was working across our four villages; people in lockdown offering messages of hope and peace through rainbows and teddies in their windows. Neighbours ringing around for a chat and helping to keep each other company whilst still keeping a physical distance. There were children and parents chalking the pavements with games and messages of hope and many other individuals and families doing what they could to share together at a time of universal uncertainty and fear.

We don't need the Troubles or a pandemic to build an inclusive community where each of us belongs. We can choose to do so at anytime through our everyday words and actions. How we treat those we don't know and those we do, is both the start point and the end point for either building something positive, strong and inclusive, or to build walls that separate, harm and isolate. May we all in 2022 choose to 'share together the ups and downs so to increase the joy and lessen the sorrow.'

ST MARY'S BUILDING TRUST

Twenty-five years ago a group of forward thinking residents in Etton worked together to form the St Mary's Etton Church Building Trust. At the time the Church required some extensive repairs and as a Grade Two Star (II*) it was felt that such a significant historical monument should be preserved. Over the years money has been raised and repairs made to continue to make the building water tight. Recently money has been spent on a new oil tank and upgrading the heating system.


